

Live Streaming Policy

Principles

This policy is based on the principles:

- 1. We seek, where possible, to worship in person as one Body.
- 2. We seek to encourage those who are ill or housebound to join our worship.
- 3. As a Church, we primarily serve those in our local area..
- 4. We protect the privacy of people and encourage participation of people in services.
- 5. We adhere to GDPR regulations as enshrined in the <u>Data Protection Act 2018.</u>

Policy

- 1. Services are live streamed but to a limited audience.
- 2. Those who wish to view the live stream are restricted to
 - Those who are ill or housebound (principle 1 and 2)
 - Regular attendees (principle 3)
- 3. The advertisement of this facility is via word of mouth and the Church bulletin.
- 4. The list of those who have been authorised to access the live stream is regularly reviewed.
- 5. The recording of the service is removed from YouTube the day (or soon after) following the service.
- 6. The filming of the service, within reasonable endeavours, is restricted to those at the lectern. Particularly, we try not to film children.
- 7. We inform people, via a displayed notice, that the service is recorded.
- 8. The sermon will be available to view, publicly, via the CCBC YouTube channel.

Live Stream Application Procedure

- 1. The Church Secretary maintains the list of those who are authorised to see the live stream.
- 2. An application to view the live stream may be made to the Pastor, elders or the Church Secretary who will then together decide whether to authorise any such application.
- 3. The implementation of the authorisation is via YouTube's private channel functionality.
- 4. The Church Secretary emails the authorised users the relevant link.
- 5. The list of the authorised users is reviewed by the Church Secretary every four weeks consulting as necessary with the Pastor and elders.
